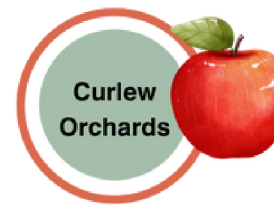
The BX Ranchlands is approximately 134 acres of agricultural land located on the outskirts of Vernon, with historical significance to the area. Stop by to learn more.



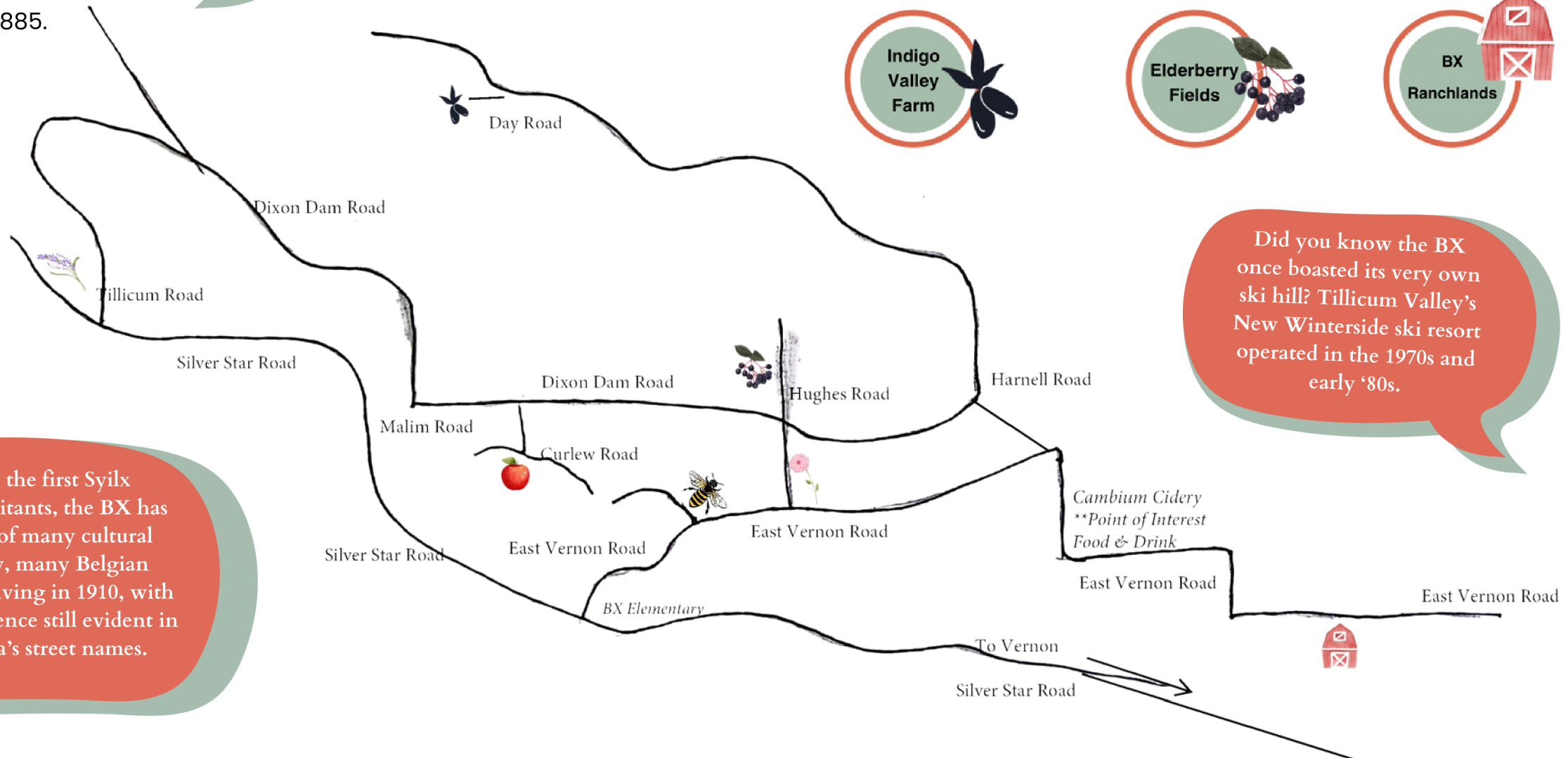
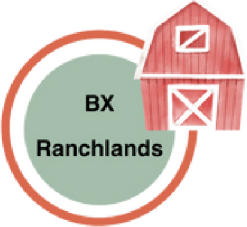
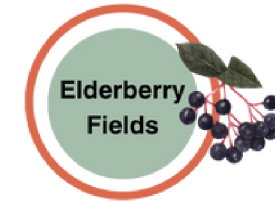

**Why is it called the BX?**  
The Valley gets its name from Francis Barnard's gold-rush era transportation service connecting Yale and the Cariboo region. Although officially named the British Columbia Express Co., it became known as "Barnard's Express," abbreviated as BX.

In addition to the first Syilx Indigenous inhabitants, the BX has seen the arrival of many cultural groups. Notably, many Belgian families began arriving in 1910, with traces of their presence still evident in some of the area's street names.

Did you know the BX once boasted its very own ski hill? Tillicum Valley's New Winterside ski resort operated in the 1970s and early '80s.
